MR. ENGLISH CALLED POLICE AFTER ARRIVING FOR WORK AT SIX FLAGS OVER GEORGIA AND FINDING MS. HANCOCK STANDING AT THE REAR ENTRY GATE. MS. HANCOCK TOLD HIM THAT SHE HAD BEEN KIDNAPPED FROM TOLEDO, OHIO AND LEFT NEAR THIS LOCATION. COBB COUNTY FIRE PERSONNEL DID CHECK HER OUT AND SHE DID NOT REQUIRE ANY MEDICAL ATTENTION. MS. HANCOCK TOLD ME THAT SHE HAD NOT BEEN PHYSICAL ASSAULTED. MS. HANCOCK ADVISED ME THAT SHE DID NOT KNOW WHERE SHE WAS AT THIS TIME. I DID CONFIRM THAT MS. HANCOCK WAS LISTED ON NCIC AS A "MISSING PERSON ENDANGERED".

AT THIS TIME I DID NOT ASK MS. HANCOCK MUCH ABOUT THE EVENT THAT HAD OCCURRED. I WAS ADVISED BY COBB COUNTY RADIO TO CONTACT SGT. CORSHAW IN TOLEDO OHIO REGARDING THIS SITUATION. I DID CONTACT HIM AND ADVISED HIM THAT I WOULD BE TRANSPORTING MS. HANCOCK TO THE PERSONS UNIT LOCATED AT COBB COUNTY POLICE HEADQUARTERS.

I CONTACTED SGT. S.C. KUCYNDA (0652) IN THE CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS UNIT AND ADVISED HIM THAT I WAS ENROUTE TO HIS OFFICE WITH MS. HANCOCK. I CONFIRMED THAT MS. HANCOCK DID NOT NEED MEDICAL ATTENTION BEFORE PROCEEDING TO THIS LOCATION.

DURING MY BRIEF CONVERSATION WITH MS. HANCOCK, SHE ADVISED ME THAT SHE DID NOT KNOW WHERE HER VEHICLE WAS AND THE SUSPECTS ONLY DESCRIBED AT THIS TIME AS TWO MALES AND A BLACK FEMALE TOLD HER SHE WOULD HAVE TO FIND IT.

MS. HANCOCK WAS TRANSPORTED TO COBB COUNTY POLICE HEADQUARTERS WHERE SHE WAS LEFT WITH SGT. KUCYNDA AND DET. C.S SPERRAZZA (1133) WHO WOULD CONTINUE THIS INVESTIGATION.

AT APPROXIMATELY 1018 HOURS, I RECEIVED INFORMATION THAT MS. HANCOCK'S VEHICLE MIGHT STILL BE IN THE SIX FLAGS AREA. THE VEHICLE WAS DESCRIBED AS A BLACK 2005 CHRYSLER 300 WITH OHIO TAG NUMBER DIA6410. THIS INFORMATION WAS TRANSMITTED TO ALL AGENCIES AND UNITS IN THE AREA. THIS VEHICLE WAS EVENTUALLY REPORTED BY DEJUN WINDLESS, WHO INDICATED THAT HE KNEW OF THE CASE AND HAD SEEN THE VEHICLE ON INTERSTATE 20 (EAST) NEAR THORNTON ROAD. OFFICER R.W. SAPP RESPONDED TO THIS AREA AND DID LOCATE THE VEHICLE PARKED OFF THE ROADWAY. I RESPONDED TO THIS LOCATION AND REQUESTED THAT HENSON'S WRECKER SERVICE BE ENROUTE TO TOW THE VEHICLE TO POLICE HEADQUARTERS FOR PROCESSING.

THE VEHICLE WAS LOCKED AND WAS PARKED ON A SLIGHT SLOPE SO IT CREATED A SLIGHT PROBLEM AS THE HENSON'S WRECKER DRIVER ATTEMPTED TO DRAG IT UP ON TO THE ROLL-BACK WRECKER. THE VEHICLE WAS EVENTUALLY SECURED ON THE WRECKER, BUT IT WAS AT AN ANGLE ON THE BED. THIS WOULD LATER CREATE AN ISSUE AS THE VEHICLE WAS BEING ROCKED OFF THE WRECKER INTO THE SERVICE BAY OF THE PROCESSING. DURING THE UNLOADING OF THIS VEHICLE IT APPEARED THAT THE ROLL-BACK BED MADE CONTACT SEVERAL TIMES WITH THE UNDER-CARRIAGE OF THE VEHICLE AS WELL AS THE LOWER BODY MOLDING ON BOTH THE DRIVER AND PASSENGER SIDES OF THE VEHICLE. AFTER SOME TIME THE VEHICLE WAS EVENTUALLY SECURED IN THE PROCESSING SHED.

DET. SPERRAZZA AND THE C.A.P. UNIT WILL CONTINUE THIS INVESTIGATION.
